About us

Birthrights is the UK's leading charity dedicated to improving maternity care through the lens of human rights. We believe that all birthing people have the right to respectful, safe, and personalised care — and that the human rights framework should be a tool to empower and protect.

- Understand what human rights in maternity care are and where they come from
- Gain confidence in recognising human rights issues and identifying actions to address them
- Feel empowered to support service users to advocate for themselves
- Build peer support networks with others committed to change

About the Baring Foundation Project

This work forms part of a wider Baring-funded project to:

- Build capacity within civil society organisations (CSOs) and colloborate on training
- Strategically use the law for systemic change
- Support campaigns for legislative reform

We have funding from the Baring Foundation Project and our aim is to collaborate with a small number of organisations, offering longer-term support to co-produce the workshops to reflect your community's specific needs.

As part of some funding we have received we're launching the first stage of our research and development phase which aims to coproduce:

We're inviting 5 community-based organisations (CSOs) to partner with us to host local conversations about maternity care, legal rights, and lived experiences — particularly with communities who are often marginalised in the health system.

If selected, your organisation will receive:

- A £1,000 grant to support logistics (venue, access, food, childcare, etc.)

- 1:1 planning support from the Birthrights team
- · Optional training on facilitation or human rights in maternity care
- The opportunity to nominate a Birthrights Advocate from your team for longerterm collaboration
